Hand-Made in a Day: 30th June 2018 Small Indian Hanging with Terry Stevenson Embroidered Scissor-Safe with Tina Leslau

Two of our own CETG members, Terry and Tina, each had 6 members and taught their respective groups how to produce two quite different stitched items.

Terry showed her group how to make a small Indian hanging by piecing patchwork rectangles together and then embellishing with sequins, beads and embroidery stitches. The range of colour choices and varied adornments produced such different and truly individual results. A wonderful collection and a project we all said we would like to repeat. A lovely idea ,Terry.

Tina taught her group how to make a pretty yet useful pocket cum scissor safe. The first task was to select and cut out the essential parts for later construction. Then the front of the pocket was identified and personal designs of embroidered stitches could be worked. The trickier part was constructing the pocket but the

reward came when a neat pair of scissors was threaded with a narrow ribbon and attached to slip in and out as required.

Once again, although instructions were followed to make the item, there was scope for each student to produce a unique piece of needle work.

All twelve ladies enjoyed sewing in the company of like-minded friends and were very grateful to their EXPERT TUTORS, TERRY and TINA.
